Labour contribution highest during the immediate post-war period

Labour demand drove prisoner transfers in the British Commonwealth:

South Africa	57,000	→	Britain
India	15,000	→	Australia

Economic asset:

- 400,000 German and 150,000 Italian POWs working in Britain at peak
- 10 % of British rural labour force in 1946
- More productive than previously assumed
- Crucial role for food production

Financial breakeven:

- Government revenue from employment substantially reduced maintenance costs
- initial liability turns into an asset
- Example: costs = revenue in Canada
