### **Social Networking**

**In a nutshell:** these sites can be defined as offering access to “personal profiles and communication”

**In a nutshell:** these sites can be defined as offering access “journal-style personal websites with comments from visitors”

### **RSS, News Feeds & Aggregation**

**In a nutshell:** these sites can be defined as offering access to “provides personalised pages of up-to-date content from news websites, blogs & other social software”

**In a nutshell:** these sites can be defined as offering “storing, organising and sharing of ‘tagged’ web links”

**In a nutshell:** “editable web pages allowing for collaborative writing”
